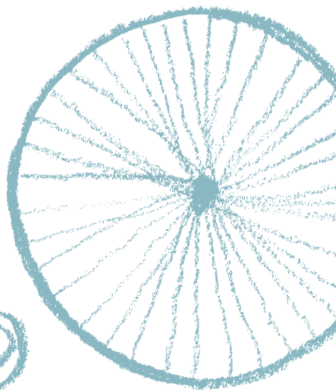
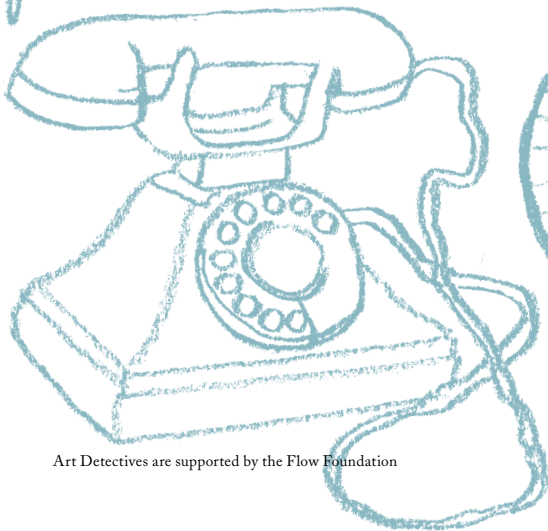


What is art?

Find ***Bicycle Wheel***, 1913 by Marcel Duchamp

Duchamp and Dalí were friends and shared ideas about art, science and games. Both made art out of everyday things. Duchamp put objects together or chose one object and presented it as art. He called these works 'readymades'.

Spot the optical illusions

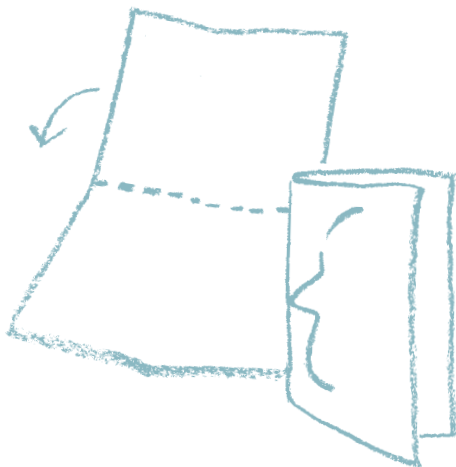


In your sketchbook

At home, put a piece of A4 in a landscape position. Fold the paper in half.

Using one line, sketch the face of someone you know when they are looking to the side. Drawing someone like this is called drawing their profile.

Make sure you draw them so their nose points towards the fold in the paper. Draw their forehead, their chin and their neck.



When you're done, cut along the line you drew.
Keep the paper folded!
